Water Saving Inspector – Water Bill

Are you saving or wasting water? Let's check out your water bill!

1. Note the graph to see if there is any sudden increase

Here you can see the average daily water consumption for the current and past six water consumption periods. It's obvious that if the consumption has increased recently.

2. Note the average daily water consumption listed on the water bill

You may divide it by the number of your household members to know the daily per capita water consumption. You can compare your figures with Hong Kong's or even the world's daily water consumption per capita (see*) .

3. Note the trend of charge you need to pay in consecutive water bills

If you think your water charges are relatively high, in most circumstances, it's because you consume more water, or you're unaware of leakage in the inside service, or you leave the water tap running unknowingly. So, please pay attention.

“Cherish Water Campus” Integrated Education Programme - Primary School aims to enhance students' knowledge about water conservation and the global water situation, and encourages them to adopt water-saving practices at school and at home, as well as to spread the water-saving message to their peers, families and the community. With the extensive support from the education sector, more than 70% of primary schools in Hong Kong have joined the programme . On 18 January 2024, WSD will hold an award ceremony to recognise the efforts of schools, teachers and students who actively participate in water conservation activities in school year 2022/23, hoping that the culture of cherishing water can be sustained.

Ngau Tam Mei Treatment Works Open Day 2023

In order to introduce the water treatment process and the associated technologies of our water treatment works to the public, WSD hosted a Ngau Tam Mei Water Treatment Works Open Day on 18 & 19 November 2023. The activity was successfully held and attracted near 1,500 members of public to visit. Visitors were guided by tour guides for a technical tour on the whole water treatment process from raw water inlet to filter beds. Various exhibition booths were set up at the exhibition gallery to showcase different newly developed projects of the department and to raise public awareness on water conservation, including “Dongjiang Water”, “Desalination”, “Water Loss Management” etc.
